<u>Freedom Days Review</u>: Interim Director, Bill Novicki reported that there had been quite a bit of media coverage and provided copies of several newspaper articles for review. Bill Clemons reported that he was informed that several community members were not aware of the events and we should be sure to explore other media channels to get the word out for future events and also during the parade there was not enough security at intersections as some cars had driven into the direction of the parade route. <u>Property Purchase (Lisbon St) Update:</u> The purchase of property at 609 Lisbon St, Sandwich was completed with the closing on September 15^{th.} The property has already had dirt brought in and grating has been done but has not yet been seeded. Naming of the new park and placement of the park sign will be discussed at the next building and grounds committee meeting.

<u>Recreation Software Integration Update:</u> A report was submitted by office manager, Shawn Rickert regarding the progress of the new online software, CivicRec.

NEW BUSINESS:

<u>Ice Rink</u>: Discussed putting up the ice rink this winter. By a show of hands vote; 4 were in favor of putting it up and 3 were not in favor of putting it up this year. We need to encourage community involvement and develop programs or other events centered around the ice rink. It was recommended to find additional ways to notify the community, such as a Facebook group to set up reminders and notification of events.

<u>Water Issue Memorial Park:</u> It is the recommendation of the board to move forward with a tile camera inspection at Memorial Park and will then review the report for more discussion.

<u>Tree Removal and Replacement Memorial Park</u>: There are two Colorado Blue Spruce Trees that need to be removed at Memorial Park.
